What Can RC 12 Do For Me?

From the President's Desk...Jeanne W. Bennett

Recently, my 93-year-old aunt, who looks and acts like she is 70, awakened on a Sunday morning and found that she could not move her legs. An ambulance was called, and she was rushed to a local hospital. When I arrived several hours later and asked what was wrong, I was informed that there still was no diagnosis and that numerous tests were being done. My second question was, "Has she been admitted, or is she under observation status?" I found that it was difficult to find someone to a definition and this question

who could give me a definitive answer to this question.

On Tuesday morning, we were informed that the diagnosis was stenosis of the spine, that my aunt was an in-patient, and that the best place for her to be was in a skilled nursing or rehab center. My cousin (her son) has spent his entire adult working life in the insurance agency. Therefore, I tried to tactfully ask him if he was aware that my aunt needed to stay three nights in the hospital in order for Medicare Part A to cover her expenses. My cousin told me that although he had worked in insurance, it wasn't "that kind of insurance" and that he was unaware of these things. Fortunately, my aunt's medical condition required her to be hospitalized for a couple more days as a physical therapist needed to do an evaluation, and a neurosurgeon needed to be involved. My aunt was then transferred to a skilled nursing home for a couple of weeks followed by a rehabilitation center for another six weeks. She has now been released to her home shortly before the end of the 60 day benefit period.

Where did I learn this information about Medicare? When this emergency and stressful situation arose, it was comforting to know that because of RC 12, I did have background knowledge and information.

RC 12 Resolution Concerning Medicare —The Board of Directors of RC 12 has submitted a resolution entitled "Patient Rights: When You're In the Hospital, Ask if You've been Admitted (Improving Access to Medicare Coverage Act of 2011). Basically, it addresses the problem of "Observation Status" vs. "Inpatient Status" and seeks legislation that would reduce or eliminate the 3-day inpatient hospital requirement.

Federal Budget Negotiations — Edward F. Coyle, Executive Director of the Alliance for Retired Americans, commented, "Conservatives in Congress now want the middle

class and the poor to pay for all additional deficit reduction, by cutting Social Security benefits, Medicare, and Medicaid while refusing to raise one dollar by closing tax loopholes and tax breaks for millionaires and big corporations. We must remain vigilant."

Remember: Social Security is under attack even though it has nothing to do with the budget or the deficit. The need to be politically active in this continuing battle to eliminate Social Security has existed ever since Social Security was created in the 1930's.

Fix the Debt is a group of business executives and onetime legislators who advocate reining in the federal deficit. Close to half the members of Fix the Debt's board and steering committee have ties to companies that have engaged in lobbying on taxes and spending, often to preserve tax breaks and other special treatment. Recently, Fix the Debt started a new national advertising campaign calling on President Obama and Congress to revise the tax code and reduce long-term spending on Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid.

What Else Can RC 12 Do For You and Me? Ilana Raskind, from the Medicare Rights Center in New York City, will be traveling to the Crystal Palace in Cobleskill on Wednesday, March 13, 2013, for our next RC 12 general meeting. Ilana Raskind is the Help Line and Volunteer Coordinator at the Medicare Rights Center. She has counseled and presented to hundreds of beneficiaries and professionals throughout New York City and New York State on various Medicare topics. She holds an M.Sc. in International Development from the London School of Economics.

I had the opportunity to hear Ms. Raskind speak at a meeting in Albany in October. She is a vibrant and energetic presenter who explains things clearly and concisely. She will provide us with an overview as well as an update on Medicare. Her presentation will include a question and answer period. During lunch, Ilana has agreed to also answer questions if anyone wishes to talk privately with her.

The Crystal Palace is a newly opened restaurant very near Howe Caverns, and we have heard rave reviews about the food and the facility. Please consider attending. This type of information can be invaluable, as I learned, when a loved one, a friend, or you yourself have a medical issue.



NYSUT members can purchase the Financial Counseling Program for an annual fee of \$260. A 403(b) Limited Plan is also available for an annual fee of \$185.


